OUR PURPOSE IS BLESSING ALL NATIONS

Genesis 12:3b Acts 3:25 Galatians 3:8

BLESSING AN ENEMY IS EXPONENTIAL

Blessing is exponentially and eternally more potent than cursing.

Follow Jesus' example — he generously shares every single spiritual blessing with us. (Ephesians 1:3)

Elevate your leadership — blessing others elevates your spiritual stature. (Hebrews 7:7) Increase your capacity — blessing others stretches your soul wide to receive greater blessing. (Luke 6:28, 38)

Giving is reciprocal — blessing our enemy breaks the power of their curse becoming a banner of God's love over us. (Acts 20:35)

AREAS OF BLESSING

Ask yourself these questions:

- What do you have within you, that you can bless this person with?
- What are your enemy's hopes and dreams that contain seeds of good?
- What redemption and hope is radiating from Father God's heart for this person?

 offer compliments, thanks, praise and gratitude (1 Thessalonians 5:15-18)

 bestow the goodwill or purpose of heaven (Luke 24:30-31, 50)





Cursing is negative speech or activities meant to wound or diminish us. These can transmit the power of negative emotions or lies.

Cursing is the use of words and sometimes activities in order to harm. For example: shaming, cancel culture, witchcraft, racial slurs, etc.

PREPARING OURSELVES TO BLESS



- Be honest about your frequent failures.
- See how Jesus' own goodness covers them.
- Clean your own house before you blame others for injustice.

Capacity to bless enemies means we scrape off as much of our accusation and anger as we can. Pursue 100% forgiveness. Strategize towards their very best outcomes in life.

Jesus' thoughts on accusation: "He who has no sin, cast the first stone." — See story of the woman caught in adultery by the religious community in John 8.

Just Apply your faith, God loves to back up redemptive blessing


Pure Lay aside your agendas, let Holy Spirit be the guide
